The Brunswick Valley Landcare Group's 'Mullumbimby Riparian Restoration Project': a three year project to revegetate and rehabilitate many sites on both public and private land and recreate corridors along the Brunswick River in Mullumbimby. It received funding from the Environmental Trust.

THE ACTION

As part of this project the BVL Group had a planting and reconciliation celebration in Mullumbimby. The planting was on the Murray's property and the work improved 300m of creek bank. Over 70 people came along to plant 1500 trees and enjoy the cultural display by the Madhima Gulgan Aboriginal Group. Athol Compton gave the 'welcome to country' and the Mullumbimby community were entertained by the "Deadly Dancers" and by Louis Cook's beautiful singing.
