Safety First at Byron Bay Wetlands

To maximise enjoyment and minimise harm during your visit please:

- A 'Group Leader' must take responsibility for all visitors within the group and must account for all group members throughout the visit and their safe departure.
- Advise the location within the site that you intend using. Refer attached map
- Please provide a mobile phone number if available, if a member of a group one contact number will suffice.
- Avoid contact with <u>any</u> water; <u>all</u> water on the site is partially treated effluent which may contain micro-organisms that can adversely affect health.
- Children must be supervised at all time, do not allow them to wander off alone. The site has hazards such as deep and shallow waters, snakes and heights that children can easily fall from.
- Beware of trip hazards and wear closed in shoes.
- Watch out for vehicles.
- Watch out for snakes. The first aid station is at the sewage treatment plant amenities building or the interpretive centre when open. It is advisable to carry snakebite compression bandages.
- Do not interfere with any valves, equipment, signs or tools at the site.
- Drive carefully when leaving the site.

<u>To help us protect and maintain the unique Biodiversity of the wetlands please:</u>

- Avoid interfering with the wildlife by throwing stones or sticks etc.
- Avoid picking flowers or damaging vegetation.
- Dispose of rubbish in the bins provided, or take it with you, remember to recycle.
- Smokers please "bin ya butts"
- Do not light any fires and report any you might see.



Please report any health, safety or environmental issues or suggestions before leaving so we can make improvements for you to enjoy at your next visit.

The Wetlands Interpretive Centre can be made available on request. It provides a meeting room, disabled access and toilet and first aid kit as well as a small kitchen.

The facility **closes at 4pm** sharp; if after hour's access or exit is required prior arrangements need to be made or a fee will apply.
